

ARTWORKS! raises \$23,000 to support Farragut's Arts Programs

Farragut Elementary School hosted their 6th annual art show and auction, ARTWORKS! on April 25 and 26 at the Walter Marks, Inc., Helms Bakery building, and raised \$23,000 to support the arts programs at Farragut.

Over 300 guests including parents, teachers, school district personnel and school Board Members, local artists, city council members and arts supporters enjoyed music by Andrew Pascoe's Jazz Quartet, hors d' oeuvres by Surfes, Caffe Roberto, and delicious desserts by Hotcakes Bakes, and a full bar by Joxer Daly's, sponsored by Councilman, Mehaul O'Leary.

Other local businesses that contributed to the success of the event were Culver Center Flowers who provided beautiful flowers and Josephson Academy of Gymnastics who provided 4 hours of gymnastics fun for the students Saturday night while their parents enjoyed the adult-only evening.

The most hotly contested live auction item was an animation cell of "Daffy Duck and Bugs Bunny", donated by local resident and Warner Brothers "Inker", Martha Sigall. It sold for \$1250. Also very popular were the beautiful homemade quilts featuring "Picasso" like self-portraits of kindergarten students.

Sunday, families attended "Community Art Day" to see the 500 pieces of student created and selected art done by Farragut Kindergarten through Fifth grade children. Arts & crafts for all ages were available, special drama entertainment games provided by parent Jonas Basom and kids' toys and silent auction items available for purchase.
